****Since Life Groups are on break, feel free to use the following study questions with your personal devotions!****

1) This week we read about the sin of Ananias and Sapphira. Their sin of deceitfulness wasn't about *how much they gave*, but *who they sought to glorify*. They wanted to glorify themselves instead of glorify God. How do the following passages help us avoid deceitfulness and give all the glory to God?

Genesis 1:26-27 - "[26] Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." [27] So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them."

Galatians 6:3-10 - "[3] For if anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. [4] But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another. [5] For each one shall bear his own load. [6] Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches. [7] Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. [8] For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life. [9] And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. [10] Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do

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good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith."

Psalm 139:23-24 - *"[23] Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me, and know my anxieties; [24] And see if there is any wicked way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting."*

Which of these verses is most helpful for you to fight the temptation to serve yourself?

2) The apostles boldly lived for Jesus in the face of opposition from Satan and the religious leaders. Read the following exhortation from Peter. How does this passage challenge you to continue living for Jesus, no matter what?

2 Peter 1:3-10 - *"[3] as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, [4] by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. [5] But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, [6] to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, [7] to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. [8] For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. [9] For he who lacks these things is shortsighted, even to blindness, and has forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins. [10] Therefore, brethren, be even more diligent to make your call and election sure, for if you do these things you will never stumble;"*

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
