GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- 1) Can you think of a time when you were influenced by somebody close to you to try something new? If so, what happened? Was it a good thing or a bad thing?

Why do you think you gave into their "peer pressure"?

- 2) This week, we learned the story of Cornelius and his conversion. He started as a devout and God-fearing man who gave generously to those in need and prayed to God regularly, and along the way he found genuine salvation in Christ and became filled with the Holy Spirit. From Cornelius' example, which of the following disciplines from his life would be easiest and which would be hardest for you to engage in:
- Genuinely seek God's guidance and direction in your prayers.
 - Become more disciplined in your study, leading and encouraging others to do the same.
 - Invite one of your non-believing friends or family members to church with you
 - Open your heart and mind to new ways that challenge you and help you to grow.
 - Treat those who are currently outside your circle with genuine care and respect.

DIGGING DEEPER

- 4) In Acts 10, Peter discovered that God's grace was for all people, from all nations, Jew or Gentile. Read the following passages about God's heart for the nations, making note of anything that confuses/stands out to you.

Acts 10:34-35 - "[34] Then Peter opened his mouth and said: 'In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality. [35] 'But in every nation whoever fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him.'"

Psalm 46:10 - "[10] Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!"

Revelation 7:9-10 - "[9] After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, with palm branches in their hands, [10] and crying out with a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!'"

Why do you think God wants to save people from all nations?

- 5) Read the following passage, then answer this: What is the purpose of God's blessing?

Psalm 67:1-2 - "[1] To the Chief Musician. On stringed instruments. A Psalm. A Song. God be merciful to us and bless us, And cause His face to shine upon us, Selah [2] That Your way may be known on earth, Your salvation among all nations."

How might God's blessing in your life cause His salvation to be known across the earth?

- 6) Cornelius is a wonderful example for us because he was not satisfied in his relationship with God, but desired to continually grow deeper. Part of that willingness to grow meant that when Peter revealed new spiritual truth (the gospel) to him, Cornelius was ready and willing to accept it. What temptations are most likely to hinder your growth spiritually?
- 7) How do the following verses encourage you to grow more spiritually mature?

Hebrews 5:12-14 - "[12] For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food. [13] For everyone who partakes only of milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. [14] But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil."

2 Peter 1:5-8 - "[5] But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, [6] to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, [7] to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. [8] For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."
