Life Group Homework For the week of September 5, 2021

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- 1) What are one or two things you enjoyed most this summer?

- 2) As you think about the next twelve weeks, what is one thing you hope to get out of your Life Group experience this quarter?

REVIEW

- 3) Looking back at your notes, what stood out to you from this week's message? (Favorite point? Questions? etc..)

DIGGING DEEPER

4) This week Paul was in a tough place. If you were in Paul's shoes, why might you question if you made the right choice to come back to Jerusalem?

5) What do you think was Jesus' purpose in speaking to Paul in the following verse?

Acts 23:11 - *"But the following night the Lord stood by him and said, "Be of good cheer, Paul; for as you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome.""*

6) In **Colossians 3:15**, Paul tells us to *"Let the peace of God rule in your hearts."* The word translated "rule" literally means to *umpire*. When we sin, we can imagine a whistle being blown in our hearts, notifying us that we've *lost* that peace of God. The Holy Spirit also uses this peace of God in our hearts to guide us in decision making. If possible, think of a time when the peace of God confirmed or opposed a decision in your life.

7) Both in Scripture and in life, God tends to give us more of a "game plan" than a "blueprint". Rather than explain to Paul the details of *when* and *how* he would get to Rome, God simply said, "You'll witness for Me in Rome." Why

do you think God often leaves us wondering about the details of His will for us?

8) This week, Lee shared that God accomplished His purpose in Paul's life - despite the fact that Paul didn't do everything perfectly. How do the following verses encourage you regarding God's purpose and plan in *your* life?

Psalm 37:4 - *"Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart."*

Psalm 119:105 - *"Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path."*

Proverbs 16:9 - *"A man's heart plans his way, But the LORD directs his steps."*

9) In Philippians 4:4-14, Paul tells us God's will for us, which applies no matter where we are in life. What are 3-4 things that we can do to be in God's will regardless of our circumstances.

Philippians 4:4-14 - *"[4] Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice! [5] Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. [6] Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; [7] and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. [8] Finally, brethren,*
