4) Paul endured quite a lot on his journey to Rome, and it started way back in Acts 21 with his arrest in Jerusalem. Why do you think God uses/allows the "roundabout" paths in our lives? Why not the expressways?

5) Read the following passage, noting any questions or highlights you may have.

1 Peter 1:3-9 - "[3] Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, [4] to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away. reserved in heaven for you, [5] who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. [6] In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, [7] that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, [8] whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, [9] receiving the end of your faith--the salvation of your souls."

6) How do the following passages help you be strong in your faith?

Romans 8:32 NLT - "Since he did not spare even his own Son but gave him up for us all, won't he also give us everything else?"

Psalm 94:3, 17-19 - "[3] LORD, how long will the wicked, How long will the wicked triumph? ... [17] Unless the LORD had been my help, My soul would soon have settled in silence. [18] If I say, "My foot slips," Your mercy, O LORD, will hold me up. [19] In the multitude of my anxieties within me, Your comforts delight my soul."

7) Read the following Psalm, and then write down at least three ways you want to have a heart more like this.

Psalm 42:1-11 - "[1] To the Chief Musician. A Contemplation of the sons of Korah. As the deer pants for the water brooks, So pants my soul for You, O God. [2] My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God? [3] My tears have been my food day and night, While they continually say to me, "Where is your God?" [4] When I remember these things, I pour out my soul within me. For I used to go with the multitude; I went with them to the house of God, With the voice of joy and praise, With a multitude that kept a pilgrim feast. [5] Why are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall yet praise Him For the help of His countenance. [6] O my God, my soul is cast down within me; Therefore I will remember You from the land of the Jordan. And from the heights of Hermon, From the Hill Mizar. [7] Deep calls unto deep at the noise of Your waterfalls; All Your waves and billows have gone over me. [8] The LORD will command His lovingkindness in the daytime, And in the night His song
