

## Romans 2:1-16 “We are Created in the Image of God”

- 1) Apparently, it's okay to judge for identification - just not for condemnation.
  
- 2) With God as Judge, there is no such thing as "the perfect crime." Men may escape human justice but they will never escape divine justice. We won't escape even one time that we have judged another...
  
- 3) Don't confuse God's patience and mercy with approval.
  
- 4) Here we have perfect justice at work. God looks at man's heart, and He evaluates a man's works and judges accordingly. The penalty will perfectly fit the crime. Every man will get his due reward, whether good or bad.
  
- 5) Thankfully, God is not only a God of JUSTICE but He is also a God of GRACE. According to JUSTICE sin must be judged and punished. According to GRACE sin can be pardoned and forgiven.
  
- 6) Today, I live to give honor to the Lord; live for His glory; and, living for eternal values (seeking for immortality) each day!
  
- 7) Every society, culture or person develops some type of a moral code that they judge others and themselves by. The remains of God's image may be marred but not destroyed, it still operates, even in the most primitive heathen.

**2 Corinthians 5:10** - *"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad."*

### DIGGING DEEPER

- 3) This week we learned about God's righteous judgment. What stands out to you from the following parable?

**Luke 18:9-14** - *"[9] Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: [10] "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. [11] "The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men--extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. [12] 'I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' [13] "And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to*

heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' [14] "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.""

Why was the Pharisee's judgment wrong?

Why was the tax collector's judgment right?

What does this parable exhort you to do (or not do)?

- 4) Many people misunderstand God's plan or purpose by focusing on this life rather than on eternal life. Read Psalm 73, noting any highlights or questions you have.

**Psalm 73:1-28** - "[1] A Psalm of Asaph. Truly God is good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart. [2] But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped. [3] For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked. [4] For there are no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm. [5] They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like other men. [6] Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them like a garment. [7] Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. [8] They scoff and speak wickedly concerning oppression; They speak loftily. [9] They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth. [10] Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full cup are drained by them. [11] And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most

High?" [12] Behold, these are the ungodly, Who are always at ease; They increase in riches. [13] Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, And washed my hands in innocence. [14] For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning. [15] If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children. [16] When I thought how to understand this, It was too painful for me-- [17] Until I went into the sanctuary of God; Then I understood their end. [18] Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction. [19] Oh, how they are brought to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors. [20] As a dream when one awakes, So, Lord, when You awake, You shall despise their image. [21] Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind. [22] I was so foolish and ignorant; I was like a beast before You. [23] Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand. [24] You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory. [25] Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You. [26] My flesh and my heart fail; But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. [27] For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry. [28] But it is good for me to draw near to God; I have put my trust in the Lord GOD, That I may declare all Your works."

Name at least seven ways the "wicked" in this psalm seem to prosper or be blessed.

In what way(s) can you relate to the psalmist?
