(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

****Since Life Groups are on break, feel free to use the following study questions with your personal devotions!****

1) In 1 Samuel 9, God used Saul's hunt for the lost donkeys to bring him to Samuel at just the right time and place. Do you think God sometimes uses our circumstances to lead and guide us? If so, why?

How do you think we can determine if a circumstance is "of the LORD" or not?

How have you seen the following verse play out in your own life?

Proverbs 16:9 - *"A man's heart plans his way, But the LORD directs his steps."*

2) This week we were reminded how man looks at outward appearance, while God looks at the heart. What does the following passage teach us about our heart?

Luke 6:43-45 - *"[43] For a good tree does not bear bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. [44] For every tree is known by its own fruit. For men do not gather figs from thorns, nor do they gather grapes from a bramble bush. [45] A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his*

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heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.”

Think back to some of the conversations you’ve had, or words you’ve used lately. What do they reveal about your heart?

3) The following passage tells us how to practically grow more and more like Jesus. What can you do this week to bear more “good” fruit and less “bad” fruit?

John 15:4-5 - “[4] *Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. [5] I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.*”

4) In 1 Samuel, God called and equipped Saul to be the king, yet when his public coronation day came - Saul was hiding among the baggage! God saves us, equips us with His Holy Spirit, and then calls us to obey and serve Him. Are there any areas where God is calling you to step out in faith, but you’re tempted to “hide among the baggage”? If so, what is God putting on your heart to do?

Take some time to surrender any hesitancy to God, and ask Him to give you boldness and more faith to obey.

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
