2) In the passage below, Jesus rebukes the church in Laodicea because they ?

Revelation 3:14-22 - "[14] *And to the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write, 'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God: [15] 'I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. [16] 'So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth. [17] 'Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'--and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked-- [18] 'I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, [that] the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see. [19] 'As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent. [20] 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me. [21] 'To him who overcomes I will grant to sit with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne. [22] 'He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.' ' '""*
