1) Jesus asked the people in *Luke 6:46 - "But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do the things which I say?"*Why do you think Jesus connects His title of "Lord" with obedience?

Does Jesus' question in Luke 6:46 apply to any specific area in your life right now?

- **2)** This week we talked about God using Satan for His plan and purpose. What does the following quote mean to you? "Sometimes God's greatest judgment is simply to let us have our own way." Warren Wiersbe
- **3)** When God was giving Israel the promised land (and taking the land away from the Canaanites), He gave them this message:

Deuteronomy 9:1, 4-6 - "[1] "Hear, O Israel: You are to cross over the Jordan today, and go in to dispossess nations greater and mightier than yourself, cities great and fortified up to heaven, ... [4] "Do not think in your heart, after the LORD your God has cast them out before you, saying, 'Because of my righteousness the LORD has brought me in to possess this land'; but it is because of the wickedness of these nations that the LORD is driving them out from before you. [5] "It is not because of your righteousness or the uprightness of your heart that you go in to possess their land, but because of the wickedness of these nations that

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the LORD your God drives them out from before you, and that He may fulfill the word which the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. [6] "Therefore understand that the LORD your God is not giving you this good land to possess because of your righteousness, for you are a stiff-necked people."

Why does God remind Israel the reason(s) He is giving them the land? What is God trying to warn Israel against?

What do you think God means by calling Israel "a stiff-necked people"?

By remembering the truth that you are simply a "sinner, saved by grace", how are you protected from the temptation to be prideful?

4) What stands out from the following passage? **John 10:10-11** - "[10] "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. [11] "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep."

How comforting to remember that God is such a *Good Shepherd*, that He restrains Satan - and even uses his *evil* for ultimate good. Spend some time thinking about where your life would be without Jesus. Thank Him for His grace in your life. Ask Him for opportunities to publicly give *Him* the glory for His many blessings in your life.

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
