5) What highlights or questions do you have from the following passage?

*Matthew 23:25-28* - "[25] "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you cleanse the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of extortion and selfindulgence. [26] "Blind Pharisee, first cleanse the inside of the cup and dish, that the outside of them may be clean also. [27] "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. [28] "Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness."

The Pharisees were the religious leaders - the religious elite - of Jesus' day. They were the most zealous in trying to live a "holy" life. Why do you think Jesus was so harsh in His rebuke to them?

Do you think it's easier for a non-believer, a new believer, or an "older" believer to fall into the trap of legalism and selfrighteousness? Why?

6) The following group of passages are often called The Romans Road to Salvation. Which verse or phrase stands out to you the most?

**Romans 3:23** - "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"

**Romans 6:23** - "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

**Romans 5:8** - "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

**Romans 10:9-10** - "[9] that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. [10] For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation."

**Romans 5:1** - "Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,"

**Romans 8:1** - "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit."

**Romans 8:38-39** - "[38] For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, [39] nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
