[5] Will You be angry with us forever? Will You prolong Your anger to all generations? [6] Will You not revive us again, That Your people may rejoice in You? [9] Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him, That glory may dwell in our land. [10] Mercy and truth have met together; Righteousness and peace have kissed. [11] Truth shall spring out of the earth, And righteousness shall look down from heaven. [12] Yes, the LORD will give what is good; And our land will yield its increase. [13] Righteousness will go before Him, And shall make His footsteps our pathway."

Galatians 2:20-21 - "[20] "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. [21] "I do not set aside the grace of God; for if righteousness comes through the law, then Christ died in vain.""

Hebrews 7:11-12 - "[11] Therefore, if perfection were through the Levitical priesthood (for under it the people received the law), what further need was there that another priest should rise according to the order of Melchizedek, and not be called according to the order of Aaron? [12] For the priesthood being changed, of necessity there is also a change of the law."
