4) What stands out to you from the following passage?

Isaiah 6:1-8 - "[1] In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. [2] Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. [3] And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!" [4] And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. [5] So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The LORD of hosts." [6] Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. [7] And he touched my mouth with it, and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, And your sin purged." [8] Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: "Whom shall I send, And who will go for Us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me.""

Why do you think Isaiah acted with such humility?

What does this passage teach you?

5) What do you think Jesus means in the following verse? *Matthew 5:20 NLT* - "[20] "But I warn you--unless your righteousness is better than the righteousness of the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven!"

Try to think of the most moral, loving, godly person you've ever known (or know of). What do you think God's view of them is *apart from Jesus*? Do you think this is fair?

6) What stands out or confuses you in the following? **Psalm 40:5-13, 16-17 -** "[5] Many, O LORD my God, are Your wonderful works Which You have done; And Your thoughts toward us Cannot be recounted to You in order; If I

would declare and speak of them. They are more than can be numbered. [6] Sacrifice and offering You did not desire: *My* ears You have opened. Burnt offering and sin offering You did not require. [7] Then I said, "Behold, I come; In the scroll of the book it is written of me. [8] I delight to do Your will, O my God, And Your law is within my heart." [9] I have proclaimed the good news of righteousness In the great assembly; Indeed, I do not restrain my lips, O LORD, You Yourself know. [10] I have not hidden Your righteousness within my heart; I have declared Your faithfulness and Your salvation: I have not concealed Your lovingkindness and Your truth From the great assembly. [11] Do not withhold Your tender mercies from me, O LORD; Let Your lovingkindness and Your truth continually preserve me. [12] For innumerable evils have surrounded me; My iniquities have overtaken me, so that I am not able to look up; They are more than the hairs of my head; Therefore my heart fails me. [13] Be pleased, O LORD, to deliver me; O LORD, make haste to help me! ... [16] Let all those who seek You rejoice and be glad in You: Let such as love Your salvation say continually, "The LORD be magnified!" [17] But I am poor and needy; Yet the LORD thinks upon me. You are my help and my deliverer; Do not delay, O my God."
