1) Read the following passage.

**Joshua 4:4-7** - "[4] Then Joshua called the twelve men whom he had appointed from the children of Israel, one man from every tribe; [5] and Joshua said to them: "Cross over before the ark of the LORD your God into the midst of the Jordan, and each one of you take up a stone on his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the children of Israel, [6] "that this may be a sign among you when your children ask in time to come, saying, 'What do these stones mean to you?' [7] "Then you shall answer them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD; when it crossed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. And these stones shall be for a memorial to the children of Israel forever.""

Why do you think God commanded the people to place these stones of remembrance?

What are three things you want to remember of how God has personally taken care of you or ministered to you?

Find someone this week (a friend or family member) who you can share a story of God's faithfulness to you.

2) In **Joshua 4:23-24**, we read about God's PURPOSE for drying up the Red Sea and Jordan — "[23] "for the LORD your God dried up the waters of the Jordan before you

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*until you had crossed over, as the LORD your God did to the Red Sea, which He dried up before us until we had crossed over, [24] "that all the peoples of the earth may know the hand of the LORD, that it is mighty, that you may fear the LORD your God forever."*

What are two purposes God had in mind for drying up these two bodies of water?

What does this teach you about God's desire for the world, and God's desire for His people?

3) Look up and read **Joshua 7** in your bible. Which of God's commands did Achan break?

Why do you think God punished all of Israel until Achan's sin was dealt with?

What does this story teach you about sin and its effects?

How might Achan have justified his sin before he was caught?

How can you protect yourself from falling into the temptation of Achan?

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
