Review: Heb. 11:28; 1 Cor. 5:7 - 'Jesus, Our Passover Lamb'

[#1] Through Faith, it is the blood of the Lamb that gives <u>ETERNAL LIFE</u> to God's people.

(John 10:27-28; Eph. 2:8-9; Judges 6:6-16)

[#2] This shows that weak <u>FAITH</u> is better than <u>UNBELIEF</u>, and you don't have to be perfect to make it into God's "Hall of Faith." (David Guzik) (Judges 6:33, 34-35, 7:2, 15)

[#3] When God works in our lives through Faith, by His Spirit, it is a joyful, thrilling experience just to see what God is able to do!

"Then the Spirit of the LORD clothed Gideon with power."

(Judges 6:34 NLT)

(Daniel 3:9-12, 17-25)

[#4] Through Faith, whenever we <u>STAND</u> for Jesus we never stand alone! He stands with us.

"So often we make the mistake of trusting in a particular outcome - rather than trusting in God, and letting Him determine the outcome. Our faith is not really in God - it's in God working in the way we desire. This is why real faith is a "But even if He doesn't" faith..."

[#5] Real Faith, fire-facing Faith is Faith that says <u>EVEN IF HE DOESN'T</u>, I won't stop trusting Him!

(Rom. 10:13-15; 1 Peter 3:15)

[#6] By Faith, like the 'heroes of faith', <u>REVERE</u> Christ as Lord in your heart ... your life will shine as a living witness to Jesus' love for a lost and dying world!

[6] In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, [7] that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, [8] whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, [9] receiving the end of your faith--the salvation of your souls."
